Inmate Bradford engaged officers on a high speed chase where he sped through residential neighborhoods at high speeds after turning off his lights and thereafter running several red lights. At any one of those red lights, an innocent teenager, mother and child, working father or elderly parent could have been hit and killed but Inmate Bradford didn't care about anyone but himself and his efforts to evade capture. He fled from his car when it came to red but was caught and found to be under the influence.

At the time of this prison commitment, his 4th, he was on parole for a felony interference with officers case for which he'd also been to prison. Additionally, he has a prior strike of attempted residential burglary and he also went to prison for being a felon in possession of a firearm.

Although I have not had an opportunity to review his 'C' file, I hope the Board will review it to determine if his conduct in prison has been any better than it has been when he has his freedom.

Mr. Bradford will undoubtedly re-offend upon his release. That is his pattern. The District Attorney of Sacramento requests that his release be delayed for as long as possible for the protection of the community.
