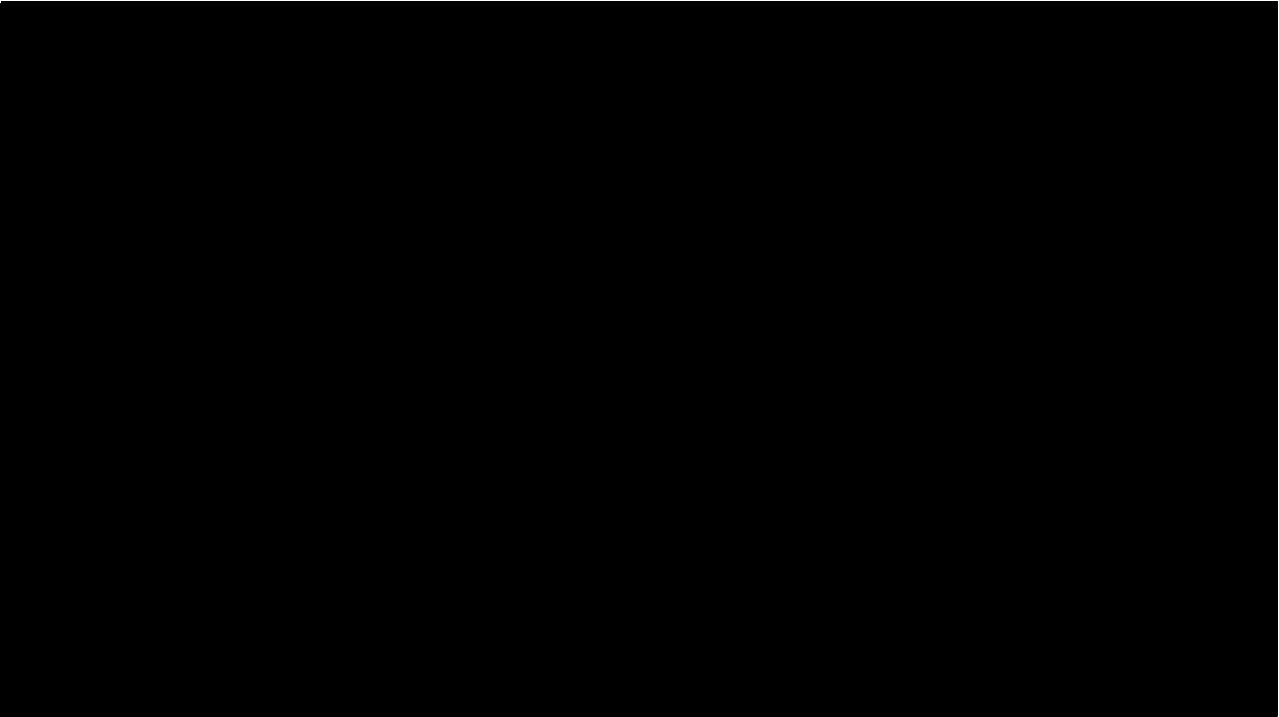

[REDACTED] He will seriously harm a member of our community when he is released. His history of extreme antisocial behavior is a virtual roadmap as to how, it is simply a matter of when.

Inmate Price will do what he wants, when he wants, and how he wants, and he will use force and violence in the process. Whether it is a cellular telephone or a woman's body, if inmate Price wants something he WILL take it, and by any means necessary.

Inmate Price is currently serving a 32 month prison sentence for violating Penal Code section 29820 and apparently now is being considered a possible non-violent second striker. [REDACTED]



Nor is his violence a danger only to those who choose to associate with him. On August 20, 2014, inmate Price was involved in a shooting in which he and another individual had an argument in front of a crowded Valero gas station. The argument escalated and the bullets started to fly. Inmate Price released a barrage of no less than 9 shots from his illegally acquired Glock .40 caliber handgun with rounds flying past patrons of the gas station and those standing nearby. It was a miracle that an innocent bystander was not killed.

Inmate Price is a poor candidate for early release and should serve his full prison term. [REDACTED] his early release would place the citizens of California in immediate danger. In the interest of justice and public safety, the Sacramento District Attorney's Office strongly opposes inmate Price's early release.
