Inmate Dominguez has had a love affair with methamphetamine [REDACTED]
[REDACTED]
[REDACTED] and was arrested in 1992 for possession of drug paraphernalia.

In 1994 he was convicted of attempted vehicle tampering and a charge of being under the influence was dismissed. It's not a big jump to conclude that he was under the influence when he allowed his judgment to be clouded and committed that offense. Later in 1994 he was convicted of two misdemeanor burglaries and once again, being under the influence. In 1995 he was convicted of felony vehicle theft and granted probation. While on probation, he committed his strike offense, residential burglary and was committed to state prison in 1996 for 32 months for the burglary and the vehicle theft. He suffered parole violations in 197, 1998, 1999 and 2000 when he was arrested for, yet again, being under the influence and possessing hypodermic needles.

While on parole, he was recommitted to prison for a second degree burglary in 2000 for 32 months.

His next offense was committed in 2008: driving under the influence of drugs [methamphetamine] and injuring another person. He was committed to state prison for 32 months and while on parole for that offense, he committed his current commitment offense of felony driving under the influence of methamphetamine.

Injuring another person and spending a great part of his adult life in prison has not ended this love affair. His current commitment will enable him to have a sustained period of sobriety [if he so chooses] and an opportunity to avail himself of the many rehabilitative programs available at CDCR. The District Attorney of Sacramento asks that he not be released until he's served his full term, giving him the greatest chance of success upon his re-entry into our community.
