Inmate Glass' strike offense was a violent strike where she stabbed another woman in the back resulting in great bodily injury during a verbal dispute over a man. She was convicted of assault with a deadly weapon and sentenced to State Prison.

Her current commitment offense involves an ongoing scheme to steal from an employer on Sundays when they were at church. Inmate Glass and her co-defendants systematically stole large portions of inventory, wigs and hair weaves, from the victims over several months, being careful to attempting to disable cameras so as to avoid detection. Eventually the massive amount of missing inventory was too much to hide and the scheme was discovered and thwarted. Inmate Glass took advantage of a position of trust to commit this crime.

Inmate Glass has proven that she'll stab someone in the back, literally, and figuratively do so by stealing from an employer who'd given her a job and trusted that his employees would not rip him off while he was at church on Sundays, the only day he took off work each week..

The District Attorney of Sacramento requests that Inmate Bell serve her full and well-deserved sentence in the interest of justice and public safety.
