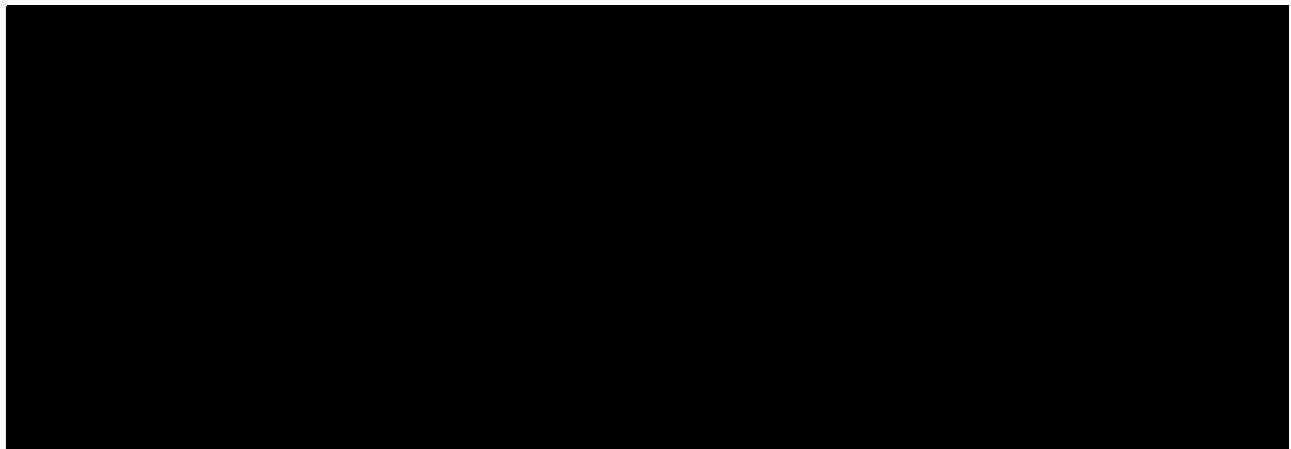

RE: Alvarado, Jesus Javier; CDCR # AT8792

Board of Parole Members,

I am writing this letter to oppose the early release of inmate Jesus Javier Alvarado, CDC# AT8792. Inmate Alvarado is currently serving 32 months in state prison for committing the crime of Felony Gun Possession, a violation of Penal Code section 25400(a)(2), with a strike prior.



In 2012, [REDACTED] he committed a violation of Penal Code section 148 when he tried to prevent the lawful arrest of his cousin. Inmate Alvarado moved in front of an officer and even laid over his cousin to prevent the arrest. Inmate Alvarado repeatedly refused to comply with the officer's command and when the officer arrested Inmate Alvarado, he physically resisted, wrestled with the officer, and then refused to get into the patrol car. Inmate Alvarado pled guilty on August 22, 2012 and was given a diversion type program.

Inmate Alvarado continued his path of criminality with the current offense. On March 20, 2014, Inmate Alvarado fled from officers on foot. During the foot pursuit, Inmate Alvarado tossed a .357 black revolver. The revolver was stolen and loaded with five rounds. Inmate Alvarado was found hiding behind a porch.

It is worth mentioning that Inmate Alvarado has been validated as a Oak Park Norteno gang member. Before fleeing from officers in the current offense, Inmate Alvarado was hanging out with [REDACTED] who has also been validated as a gang member.

Inmate Alvarado is a poor candidate for early parole and should serve his full prison term. The combination of violence, weapons, and gang association makes Inmate Alvarado an unreasonable risk to the citizens of California. In the interests of justice and public protection, the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office strongly opposes his early release.
