Board of Parole Members,

Inmate Thomas committed [REDACTED] numerous burglaries [REDACTED]. With each violation Inmate Thomas revealed his disregard for the law. Now that he is seeking early release from the latest in a [REDACTED] string of burglaries, one thing is certain, his release means more offenses are to come.

In 2012 Inmate Thomas began a two year sentence after committing [REDACTED] burglary. In this instance, Thomas broke into a residential home through a wooden fence, smashed a garage window and broke the lock on the interior door. Inside, Thomas stole three televisions, searched dresser drawers in the master bedroom, and stole a jewelry box leaving his fingerprints throughout the home. After this sentence, Inmate Thomas was released and back to business as usual. By February, he was caught on CCTV breaking into the victim's home and stealing three decorative swords. This offense earned Inmate Thomas a four year prison sentence.

Despite Inmate Thomas's [REDACTED] criminal history he is now seeking an early release. Early release is for those who have been rehabilitated and can respect the law. Inmate Thomas is not an appropriate candidate for early release as he has displayed neither of these qualities. His past actions have told the world, loud and clear, if he is released lock your doors and shut your windows because it is only a matter of time before he is back to business. In the interest of law and justice the Sacramento District Attorney's Office strongly opposes Inmate Thomas's early release.
