Inmate Ribota is a well-established violent felon, and should not be paroled. The circumstances surrounding his current conviction and his prior criminal record show that he poses an unreasonable risk of violence to the community.

On April 30, 2014 law enforcement responded to a female being assaulted at a residence. It was reported that the male that had committed the assault also possessed a firearm. When law enforcement responded three male subjects were seen standing in front of the residence. One of the males, later identified as Ribota, fled into the home.


Another Officer noticed that the male that had fled into the home was now running through the back yard and jumping fences. Ribota was apprehended shortly after fleeing. In Ribota's path of travel a loaded extended magazine with 21 rounds and a .40 caliber firearm that was missing the magazine were located. After being apprehended, Ribota gave a false name and was found to be in possession of several morphine pills.

One of Ribota's criminal conquests illustrates the danger he poses to the community. In 2004 Ribota, [REDACTED] went to commit a home invasion robbery. Ribota, [REDACTED] were all validated Norteno gang members at the time. During the robbery a struggle ensued and one of the targeted victims shot [REDACTED] in the chest and he died from his injuries.

Those who ignore history are doomed to repeat it. In considering Ribota's fitness one should give credence to that saying. [REDACTED] a felony assault conviction, 2005 strike conviction from the home invasion detailed above, parole violations in 2006 / 2007 / 2008, conviction for being a felon in possession of a firearm in 2009, parole violations in 2012 and 2013, then the current commitment offense.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on inmate Ribota's prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that inmate Ribota should not be released as he poses a significant, unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Parole should be denied.
