Inmate Arceneaux was stopped for a traffic violation and found to be in possession of 18 grams of methamphetamine and a stolen .40 caliber semi-automatic Smith and Wesson, fully loaded with a round in the chamber. While this would be concerning behavior for anyone, it is particularly alarming given this inmate's prior history.

[REDACTED] He was convicted of misdemeanor domestic violence [REDACTED] and then went [REDACTED] to prison for first degree burglary with a prior strike. Although the facts of that offense are unknown at this time, I would note that he had an assault with a deadly weapon dismissed when he plead and received a 9 year prison sentence. While in prison, he was arrested for possessing drugs while in prison. He violated parole repeatedly upon his release and in 2012 was given the benefit of a misdemeanor when he possessed methamphetamine. He was arrested for being a felon in possession of a gun in 2013 which was not filed, but the gun was not forgiven on his most recent offense.

I have found that methamphetamine is associated with violent crime more than any other drug, in my 35 years' of experience as a prosecutor. The possession of large quantities of methamphetamine and a fully loaded and chambered semi-automatic firearm by a person with multiple prior strikes does not bode well for society. The District Attorney of Sacramento urges the Board to find that this inmate unsuitable for early release.
