Inmate Heisler is a threat to public safety. This is his seventh prison commitment for which he is serving an enhanced sentence due to a prior strike conviction. The circumstances surrounding his current conviction and his prior criminal record show that he poses a risk to the community.

Inmate Heisler's criminal history dates back to 2006, where he committed his first of four misdemeanor crimes. Thereafter in 2011 he committed his first of twelve felony convictions. Defendant has a drug history, along with thefts ranging from second degree burglary, grand theft, identity theft to residential burglary, his strike conviction. Even after serving prison commitments for seven of his felony convictions, he continues to reoffend after being released. His current commitments involve forged checks and the possession of multiple victim's identifying information including credit cards and ID's. Numerous Victims reported that their cars were broken into and thereafter fraudulent charges were made on their credit cards. Inmate Heisler has repeatedly returned to criminal activity and has displayed he will continue to do so.

Moreover, Inmate Heisler should not even be considered for early release as he is likely not eligible due to a felony conviction for Residential Burglary pursuant to Penal Code Section 667.5(c)(21). Aside from being ineligible, his consistent and increasing criminal history from 2006 to date illustrates that he is a danger to the community and is certain to reoffend if released. In the interest of justice and public safety, the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office opposes his premature parole.
