Re: Silveira, Victor CDC # BB4002 Court Docket: 15F07285

If released, inmate Silveira can be counted on to arm himself with a gun and continue to commit crimes. It is not reasonable to conclude that he does not present a violent risk to our community.

On December 1, 2015 sheriff's deputies conducted a probation search at Silveira's residence. Inside, they found cash, a billy club, about one pound of methamphetamine, and two stolen guns – one of which was loaded. He pled to a two strike term of 5 years 8 months, admitting his prior strike conviction for his 2001 residential burglary.

His criminal history has been basically non-stop since 1993. He has multiple prior prison terms for crimes including auto theft, residential burglary, and narcotics sales. He has convictions for stalking, threatening witnesses, carrying a concealed firearm, and DUI. Despite constantly being released back to the community, he simply continues in risky, dangerous activity.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on inmate Silveira's prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that inmate Silveira should not be released as he poses a significant, unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Parole should be denied.
