RE: **Zeeb, William** CDC # **AY1085** Sacramento Superior Court case **15F02918**

At age 23, Inmate Zeeb is clearly just hitting his stride as a criminal. He sustained his first felony conviction for his strike, residential burglary in 2012 in Contra Costa County. Shortly thereafter, it appears that Contra Costa elected to proceed on a violation of probation in lieu of a receiving stolen property and felon in possession of a firearm prosecution in 2012. Thereafter, in 2013, he committed an offense which is virtually identical to the offense for which he is currently serving time in state prison. He stole a vehicle and then drove on the wrong side of the road to evade pursuing officers. He received 32 months in State Prison for that offense in 2013.

On 4/19/15, he was arrested in Pleasant Hill for a P.R.C.S. violation when he was found in possession of burglary tools, stolen property, and identity theft materials. It is unclear how long he was in custody there but by 5/13/15, he had stolen another vehicle and made his way to Sacramento. He first came to officers' attention here when he was driving the wrong way down a one way road and was coming right at the officers. They turned their vehicle around in order to apprehend him, but he continued driving down the street in the wrong direction at 50 mph when the posted speed limit was 30 mph. The officers ceased their chase of the inmate because it was too dangerous. The inmate then jumped out the stolen vehicle he was driving and fled on foot. Officers were able to arrest him and discovered that the vehicle he was driving had been stolen out of Vallejo, CA.

It's a sad state of affairs when officers feel constrained to let a dangerous driver best them in a chase in order to reduce the risk of harm to innocent civilians on the roadway. Since Inmate Zeeb has wantonly demonstrated time and again that he cares for no one but himself and has no problem with putting others at risk in order to achieve his criminal ends, he presents an ongoing threat to public safety. As such, his early release as a non-violent second striker should be denied.
